


### Stepping in faith into a new season of ministry


### Mountain View District Office has a New Phone Number

## United Methodists joined Ecumenical Faith Communities at "Recovery-Ready Congregations" Summit

On August 28, faith leaders and congregants from across Central Virginia came together for *Recovery-Ready Congregations: Building Hope, Healing, and Community.* Hosted by <a href="https://docs.org/leaders.com/health.">The UP Foundation</a> in collaboration with <a href="https://docs.org/Horizon Behavioral Health.">Horizon Behavioral Health</a>, the summit provided pastors, ministry leaders, and church members with practical tools and spiritual insight to create supportive, recovery-friendly congregations.

Mountain View District UMC's were well represented at the event with a team of 5 laity from Smith Memorial UMC in Colllinsville, 7 clergy from various churches, and Sandra and Tee Fulcher who shared the story of the birth of their non-profit, Bethel New Hope, that provides transitional housing for people in addiction recovery.

"We believe the Church has a vital role to play in offering hope and healing. Through education, testimony, and fellowship, congregations left this summit empowered to walk alongside those on the journey to recovery." said Dr. James R. Stewart.
